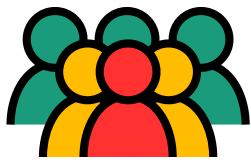
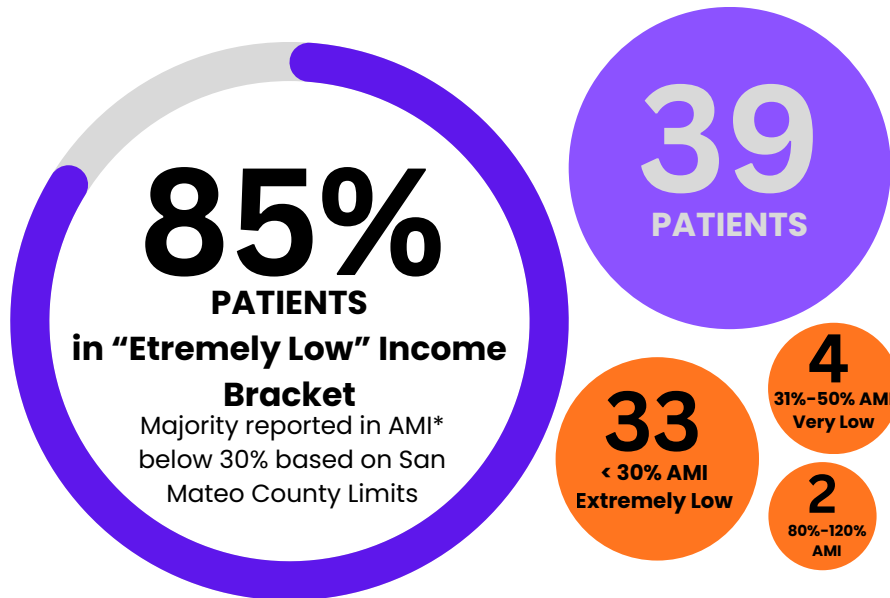


2026 Community Dental Health & Demographic Snapshot

Participant data from services provided by Magic Tooth Bus to Gene Mullin Community Learning Center

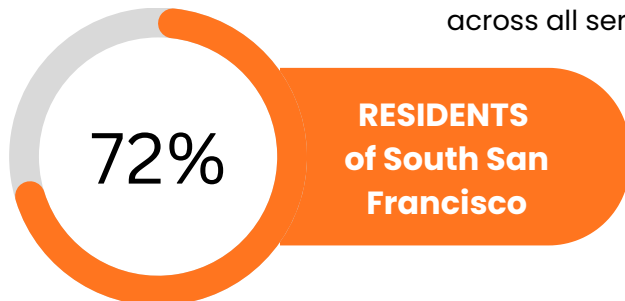


Socioeconomic & Demographic Profile

Summary and Recommendations

Summary overview of the 2026 snapshot report provided by Magic Tooth Bus to Gene Mullin Community Learning Center along with our recommendations on community needs.

3 Visits | 39 Smiles | 100% Satisfied

Summary of findings from snapshot report:

1. **Patients:** Nearly every family cared for self-reported in “Extremely Low” to “Low” income brackets (Area Median Income (AMI) under 50%), of which over 50% identified as LatinX/ Hispanic.
2. **Caries Risk Assessment:** 67% of the community members who received a dental screening have had tooth decay experience. One patient needed urgent dental care. 31% of the community members who received a dental screening and found to be at a lower risk of tooth decay were young children. This means many children are off to a great start to their oral health journey, but still need to maintain excellent oral hygiene.
3. **Fluoride Varnish Application:** This is minerals added to the teeth to help prevent tooth decay. Majority of the patients consented to receiving the treatment. Those who opted out either saw a dentist less than six months ago, or were too young to receive the treatment.
4. **Residency:** 28% of the patients who visited Magic Tooth Bus were from other cities including Daly City, San Bruno, and San Francisco.
5. **Post-Visit:** Patients were asked to complete a survey at the end of their visit. Many left feeling motivated to schedule a dental appointment to improve and continue their oral health journey. Children were provided oral health education where they learned the proper brushing and flossing techniques. All patients left with new oral hygiene kits to maintain their oral hygiene, and provided positive feedback on the services they received.

Recommendations

1. **Increase Preventative Care Efforts:** Enhance the frequency and reach of fluoride varnish applications and other preventative measures to further lower caries risk among high-risk groups.
2. **Targeted Education and Outreach:** Develop educational programs tailored to the LatinX/Hispanic and Asian communities to further engage and inform them about dental health best practices.
3. **Expand Service Accessibility:** Consider expanding the services of the Magic Tooth Bus to reach more communities within similar socioeconomic brackets to maximize impact.
4. **Follow-Up Mechanisms:** Establish a robust follow-up system to ensure that participants who intend to schedule dental appointments do so in a timely manner, further improving oral health outcomes.
